Reading-Linked Tasks

- 1. Before you watch the clip, make a **prediction** using the image below. What might happen in the video?
- 2. Look at the next image and think about the title 'The Girl and the Robot'. Write another **prediction** or add more information to your original prediction. What do you think might happen now? Remember to use the word 'because' to explain what you have seen that influences your prediction.

- 3. Write a <u>summary</u> of the clip (use a maximum of 50 words). Once you've written your summary, try to write another one with a maximum of 10 words (you have practised this in class!).
- 4. Create a mind map full of vocabulary linked with machinery, cranks, pipes, spanners, sprockets and bolts. You can use this vocabulary in your written work if you choose.
- 5. Draw an emotions line graph to show the girl's different emotions throughout the clip. (You may have done this in class before, below is an example from a different story.)

Writing Tasks

- 6. Design a robot of your own and label it. Write a set of instructions to explain how to build your robot.
- 7. Write the story of how your robot takes over the world!

- 8. Write a diary page for the girl, charting her successes and failures. Make sure you use emotive language to describe her frustrations.
- 9. Write an ending for the clip. What happens next?
